Theological and Doctrinal Survey (Part 1)

This is the first in a series of articles about the Doctrinal and Theological Survey that was recently conducted at Westminster Baptist Church.

We had received approximately 100 completed surveys. Analyzing all the results will take some time. However, this article will explain more fully the reasons the survey was conducted and dispel any concerns that this church is changing its doctrinal stance.

That second point is easy to address. No. The church staff is not changing or even contemplating changing the doctrinal stance of Westminster Baptist Church. We will remain Bible-believing, Bible-preaching, and Bible-teaching Southern Baptist! I hope that quells any concerns some of you may have.

The first point, however, requires a lengthier explanation.

As many of you may recall, we briefly explain the survey when it was introduced during a "ministry moment." However, bad weather played havoc with attendance, and a lot of you never heard about the survey until you found it inside your bulletin one Sunday morning.

About a year ago, Florida-based Ligonier Ministries commissioned LifeWay Research to conduct a nationwide survey of the theological understanding of Americans, providing comparisons between (a) Christian church goers and the unchurched and (b) Evangelicals and non-Evangelicals. Ligonier Ministries was founded by R.C. Sproul, whose name may be familiar to some of you. Sproul is a Reformed theologian with a Calvinist leaning. LifeWay is affiliated with the Southern Baptist Convention, which for the most part does not subscribe to Calvinist theology.

Anecdotal evidence has shown a declining theological understanding in America, both inside and outside of the church. Where that gets really serious is when people and/or churches move from primary Christian doctrine to non-biblical doctrine. That shift can be summarized by the Ligonier-LifeWay survey's documenting that more and more Christians are shifting from a biblical world view to a secular world view.

So what are we to make of the state of theology in America? As the chairman of Ligonier Ministries put it: "What comes screaming through this survey is the pervasive influence of humanism." That even applies, although to a lesser degree, to Evangelicals who took the survey.

C. S. Lewis said, "If you do not listen to theology, that will not mean that you have no ideas about God. It will mean that you will have a lot of wrong ones."

The Ligonier-LifeWay survey says he's right.

"Americans like God, Christ, and even the Bible.

But we like those things on our own terms

and according to our own tastes."

In both surveys, questions focused on several key doctrinal areas in order to determine where Americans differ from historic and orthodox views. Those areas were beliefs about: (1) God; (2) goodness and sin; (3) salvation and religious texts; (4) heaven and hell; (5) the Church; and (6) authority.

The question facing us is "What is the state of theology at Westminster Baptist Church?" Can we identify our strengths and our weaknesses? How do we "treat" any pervasive weaknesses?

In future *Witness* articles, we will look at the questions and responses in more detail and compare our responses to those on the national survey.

Hope Has Sprung


For the first time in quite a while it is beautiful outside. As I write the warm sun bears down starting to erase the white flaky remnants we have from this long and hard winter. Like many people I love summer with the crack of bats, the smell of a Wisconsin bratwurst, and the refreshing feel of a lake or pool. Winter on the other hand is an annoyance to me in anything other than small doses. These facts are exactly why the first warm day has always filled me with hope; it is a sign of new life springing forth out of winter's gloom. The past few years I have come to see spring as an illustration of the Christian life heading from the darkness of winter into the joy of summer.

C.S. Lewis aptly portrayed the fallen world as a world in constant winter in his *Chronicles of Narnia* series. In the beginning God made everything perfect and beautiful but when Eve took that first bite of the forbidden fruit that perfection is corrupted with rot and death. Men became separated from God under judgment that day in Eden and much like the barren trees and bitter cold of winter, the fall brought misery and pain. In certain parts of the planet the only creatures to be seen in winter are scavengers who survive off of finding any creature from the summer and destroying it; in Eden we became those scavengers and evil humanity began to make this fallen world worse and worse perpetually to this day. Apart from Christ, the winter would only get colder and colder as none of us would ever be able to save ourselves.

It is wonderful to celebrate the birth of Christ in the heart of winter, for the incarnation is a tale of how God entered into humanities dark winter and became the only person able to earn salvation. On the cross Jesus took on that winter as he stood in our place and took the punishment that we deserve in our place. Jesus rose from the dead in spring and his resurrection would point to a new and better eternal summer that he had won for us. Even though Jesus deserved summer for himself, he took on the coldest winter so that we might receive the beautiful summer only he deserves as he stood condemned in our place and now we stand counted with his righteousness. When we die as Christians we will enter into something greater than even Eden; God has saved us to return to the summer so long lost.

It is easy to realize that the Christian life is anything but that glorious summer we await. Though we await the summer we are born again unto, we have not fully seen our salvation for this life's winter and death. We are not fully saved yet in this Christian life, we still experience the pains and judgment on this fallen world. As many theologians would say; though we have been saved when we were born again, we are continuing to be saved, and one day we will be finally saved. The Christian life is a sample of the warmth of summer and it is the breaking away from life's dead winter; the life of a Christian is the spring of life. That moment we first come to Christ is like the first warm day of the year; starting that day things begin to look more and more like summer and less and less like winter. Growth in the Christian life moves us forward to our heavenly summer home and our lives will progressively appear like that beautiful summer even amidst the darkness and death. In the Christian life it would not be accurate to say everything is repaired from the fall, but it is

getting better as the Holy Spirit moves us towards our great Canaan. Spring is kind of a diet Summer and so this Christian life may have suffering but it is a diet version of God's great kingdom in the new heavens and new earth. Christians have hope and non-Christians be prepared for before long spring will make way into summer and this life of pain and suffering will be no more.







Psalm 16:7-11 (NIV)⁷ I will praise the LORD, who counsels me; even at night my heart instructs me.⁸ I have set the LORD always before me. Because he is at my right hand, I will not be shaken.⁹ Therefore my heart is glad and my tongue rejoices; my body also will rest secure, ¹⁰ because you will not abandon me to the grave, nor will you let your Holy One see decay.¹¹ You have made known to me the path of life; you will fill me with joy in your presence,

with eternal pleasures at your right hand.

On Thursday mornings, I join several pastors in our community to pray for revival in our land. Before we pray, we spend time in fellowship and I must admit sometimes the laughter is uproarious, and is most therapeutic! Laughter is good for the soul!

A pastor I've never met, Steve Mayner, once wrote, "One of the reactions I get when I talk to people about giving one's life completely to God is that if they do, life will be boring! They think a 'devout' Christian means you have to walk around with a sad face all the time, never laughing at anything." Pastor Mayner and I both heartily disagree!

A lot of the seasonal Easter movies about Christ don't help do they? How many movies about Christ have you watched where He has always got this really serious look on his face and He never cracks a smile?

Like Pastor Mayner, one of my favorite scenes from the movie "The Passion of the Christ" is the flashback scene where Jesus is laughing and joking around with his mother. THAT is the Christ that we need to know more about.

Do some study of the Gospels, especially the cultural context in the original language of some of the parables, and you'll discover when Christ spoke some of those words they would have been taken more as a punch line than the solemn way we read them! (Matthew 7:3-6, 19:23-24, Luke 7:31-32, 11:1-13, 14:16-20, 18:1-5, etc.) I think Christ could have some fun, and those around him could too! (After all He and his disciples went to a wedding feast!)

Don't get me wrong... we all have had our fair share of challenges. We all face life's storms, and at those times it is great to know there is One who stands beside us who gives us peace and seriously hears our petitions. But sometimes even in the middle of the storm, a good laugh might be one of the most godly things you can do!

As Pastor Mayner says, "Laugh a little... it's OK, really!"
