

## Zootopia and the Gospel of Reconciliation



My family has always been major cinephiles. From a very young age going to the movie theatre with my parents and siblings has been a common occurrence. Prior to this past Friday that tradition had not been passed down to my own children. We had just never gotten around to taking the kids out to the theatre. This past weekend my parents were visiting from Illinois and they treated the four of us to our first family movie. Before choosing to take my young children to a movie I thoroughly researched the films in theatres in order that I could best help my children form a worldview. We ended up going to Gettysburg to see the new Disney animated film Zootopia. Zootopia was fantastic and the kids thoroughly enjoyed it, but what impressed me most about Zootopia was its thoughtful and convicting message. Zootopia may not be a "Christian" movie, however, it demonstrates a prominent element of the Gospel. Perhaps greater than any "Christian" movie I have ever seen.

Before exploring the profoundly positive lessons of Zootopia, I would like to note that there are a small handful of ways that Zootopia conflicts with our Christian worldview, and note a few warnings for parents of young children. Zootopia is rated PG for a reason as several scenes imply violence. Children's films have a tendency to over simplify good versus evil, but that is not even remotely the case in Zootopia. In Zootopia racism is explored even in its most subtle forms and even the films greatest heroes are at times guilty of heinous prejudice. Zootopia essentially echoes the song from a far more vulgar play, "Everybody's a Little Racist." Zootopia shows us how hurtful even subtle stereotypes can be and it inspires viewers to be introspective and try to be part of the solution. All the while Zootopia is constantly hopeful that even the very worst of us can change, while it demonstrates how mixed motivations are involved in all of our moral decisions.

The aspirations of Zootopia will never be fully seen in human society, and to a significant extent Zootopia even admits that fact. There is hope that the makers of Zootopia may not be aware of themselves. The dream of reconciliation and tolerance will be fully seen in Christ's church in the new heaven and new earth. Christ's kingdom makes no value distinctions between genders, races, languages, economic classes, or cultures. All come to the table through Christ's bloodshed in their place alone. Because of Christ's death people of all forms and backgrounds become one family, as the movie's white upper class American male becomes more family with an impoverished African woman than he is with his own flesh and blood.

Zootopia was a brilliant and inspirational film. While Zootopia never claims to be a "Christian" movie, it does not even mention Christ at all. It is far better at instilling a Christian worldview than many recent films targeted at the Christian community. I highly encourage every parent seeking to raise children to serve the Lord to take your whole family to Zootopia and take time to discuss how we see Jesus in its dream of a tolerant world.

### Forgiveness is Freedom

"It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery. Galatians 5:1NIV

Several women in our church had the privilege of attending the March 2016 Women's Conference at Hanover First Church of God. Sylane Mack spoke eloquently about the fullness of freedom that is found in forgiveness. Her story is heartrending, yet she stands today a woman of grace, full of passion for her Lord and Savior. Her life is a reflection of her victory in Jesus.

Driving home that first evening of the conference, my heart was so heavy it hurt after hearing the horrendous accounts of Sylane's childhood abuse at the hands of her immediate family. I'm sure every woman at the conference experienced pain and sadness for the child whose innocence was stolen from her. We returned the following day to hear the rest of the story - a powerful, uplifting testimony of the incredible love of Jesus that saved her, healed her, and set her free.

Sylane's redemption is grounded in biblical truth. She shared Scripture verses, one after the other that sustained her through her ordeal, taught her how to forgive, and continue to transform her. God's Word revealed to her that real forgiveness is possible. She learned how to live out forgiveness, day by day... moment by moment. Sylane was able to forgive herself, and most importantly, she chose to live in the freedom of forgiveness.

According to Jesus, forgiveness is not optional if we are to live our lives as children of God. We must forgive if God is to forgive us (Mark 11:25-26). Often times, we wait for the ones who hurt us to admit their wrongdoing, but that was not Christ's example. As He suffered on the cross, we have no


> accounts of His persecutors shouting apologies before Jesus lifted His voice to heaven, asking His Father to forgive them because they had no idea that they were killing the Son of God (Luke 23:34). Forgiveness means we give up our "right" to an apology or revenge.

> Forgiving is not about denying what was done to us or forgetting the hurt. It is an intentional act to yield to and embrace the power of God's love to forgive as the Lord forgave us (Colossians 3:13). Forgiveness

If you'd like to learn more about Sylane's story, her life-changing autobiography entitled "Convinced!" recounts her journey from brokenness to healing through the transforming power of God. Her ministry, Transformed by Grace, Inc. (www.transformedbygrace.org), shares biblical truths of the transforming grace of Jesus Christ. She carries out this mission through her conference speaking and counseling 160 23:34 ministries.

**A special thank you** to all of you at WBC for your prayers and financial support allowing Pastor Larry and myself to travel back to Macaty, Haiti in March. This was the 4th year in a row for me to teach at the Pastor's Conference and the 2nd year for Pastor Larry. I taught through 1 & 2 Timothy, and Pastor Larry gave instructions for Biblical Interpretation.









After arriving on Friday, we helped distribute new Bibles to over a dozen new converts in a nearby town. On Sunday, with a hard rain coming down, we traveled to Macaty for services. Pastor Larry sang *Great is Thy Faithfulness* and I preached on the importance of prayer. After the service, we met with church and community leaders to discuss future plans/projects for their community. We discovered in our conversations that there are at least 2000 people living in Macaty. Many are women who are widowed, many men need work, and most children are not getting a proper education. They were very grateful for the dresses and school supplies that we provided. Monday-Thursday, we taught morning and afternoon sessions at the Pastors' Conference. Local flooding prevented some from attending, but the ones who came were grateful.

On Friday, we traveled back to Macaty to pray with the church. We walked slowly through the village and made several home visits. We prayed and sang hymns over the people as we prayed against the darkness and oppression of voodoo. Then we gathered in a circle inside the church to pray together. We had meaningful conversations, shared names and heard some amazing testimonies of what God has done in the lives of these Haitians. They shared how much it means to them that we keep coming back.

Trust and friendships are getting deeper which will open up many doors for us in the future years ahead. Lord willing, in November, I will be traveling back and taking a few of our musicians with me. We are planning on teaching a music workshop with some local music teachers. We will be sharing the Gospel as we learn music theory. I also plan on doing some deacon and evangelism training with Pastor Nevel and his church leaders. The harvest is ripe in Haiti. The Light of Jesus and His Church must penetrate the darkness to free the souls of these dear people I have grown to love. Every time I go, it is harder to adjust to our culture when I return.

The petty things that bother so many here in the US church, quickly fades in the big picture of what God has called us to do as we Go to the nations. The hearts of worshipers that are truly dependent on God are so different when compared to the shallowness of a self-absorbed, "meet all of my needs" mentality that we suffer from here at home. Never once did I hear a complaint about serving. No excuse was given when a prayer service was held for hours. The people wanted to be there, they wanted to serve and pray. May God return us to having our eyes fixed on Him, our knees bent in prayer, and our hearts in alignment with God's own heart.



As I write this newsletter article I am preparing for a multi-church Good Friday Service and a wonderful celebration of the resurrection of Jesus Christ this Easter Sunday morning. Today is a beautiful spring-like day, the sun is shining, and just as the seasons are moving from the dead of winter to the new life of spring, so we celebrate our new life in Jesus Christ. If your life in Christ has become a little routine, a little

dull, there's no better time than right now to pray for a reinvigorated life. Just recently a church member mentioned to me that it had been her prayer last year to love Christ more than ever. At the same time she recommitted herself to regular reading of the Scriptures. She discovered over the months of praying for a greater love for the Lord, and reading God's Word, that He did it! She commented, that though she did not actually plan it this way, it was that regular reading of God's word that led to the answer of her prayer for a greater love of Jesus! She then commented, "Isn't it funny how God does that?"

My prayer for each of us here at Westminster Baptist Church is precisely that - that the Lord may be our first love, and that as a result our lives will be totally transformed. As I preached this past Palm Sunday, may we see this world through the eyes of Jesus, and see a lost world in need of a Savior. May the world know that we are Christians by our love for Jesus, our love for one another, our love for his Word, and our love for the lost.

Will you join me and pray that prayer in this Easter season and beyond?

Also let me share with you our upcoming sermon plans. After Easter, there is one more sermon in my series of sermons on the I AM's of Jesus - the one Sunday this winter we had to cancel because of snow, shoved my sermon schedule back by one week. As a follow-up to that series that clearly identifies Jesus with the great I AM of the Old Testament, we will be studying the book of Colossians. This short book by the apostle Paul emphasizes the supremacy of Christ in all things, and how that practically affects our lives. I look forward to sharing that series of messages with you all!

May God be at work in your lives and May God bless you all.
